I. Call to Order 9:35am

II. Approval of Minutes from October 12, 2022, no corrections and the minutes will stand as presented.

III. Principal's Report

- a. Thank you all for last month's Principal Recognition
- b. Thank you to all of you that came out to the 8th Grade Open House. Families were very excited to be here. It helped families realize that LHS really is a top-notch school. Thank you to the volunteers who gave up their Sunday to come out and show incoming families that LHS is just as good as the private schools.
- c. Courtyard-Received an email from Design and Construction for the school division that someone from organization Get to Green will be coming out to determine where at our school an outdoor learning space can be located. The only space that is open for the learning center is the last courtyard that Chrissie Lavin was beginning to work with the landscapers to renovate. This is a school board mandate that every school in Fairfax County will have an outdoor open air learning space. This is in the beginning phase of implementation and LHS is one of the first schools in the county to install one of these spaces. Information is limited at this point. Money that has been set aside to renovate that space can now be reallocated.
- d. Vaping-In addition to vaping, concerns are growing because there have been cases in FCPS of Fentanyl overdoses. In past years the bathroom doors were left open, but due to the outrage of a few parents the school board told the school the doors had to be closed since not all bathrooms have privacy partitions at the entrance. There are now 2 other bathrooms in the main office that are marked as Staff/Students that the students have access to if they are not comfortable in one of the bathrooms without a partition. All secondary schools in Fairfax County now have Narcan. Administrations were taught how to administer if a student does overdose. The school needs the backing of the PTSA to keep the bathroom hallway doors open for the safety of our students. Bathroom stall doors will remain intact.

- b. 8th grade Open House-As Mrs. Greer mentioned, what a successful day it was. Thank you to Keuri Patel and Tian Olson and all the many volunteers that came to help that day.
