- 2020-2021 Financial Review Committee Update & Recommendations
 - Committee recommended that the budget going forward be more transparent, budget will now be posted with the board meeting minutes on website
 - Motion to approve 2020-2021 Audit Report-Denys King & Jill Holloman. All approved
 - Next week 9/22/2021 at the GMM there will be a vote to adopt the Financial Review
 - O Thank you to the Review Committee for all their hard work
 - PTSA 2021-2022 Budget Review
 - Executive Committee reviewed and updated 2021-2022 budget over summer
 - Went back to 2018 & 2019 to forecast the budget
 - Conservative with Donations at \$54,000
 - Increased budget for Family Network for Freshman/New Student Orientation
 - Increased Hospitality budget due to prices of goods increasing
 - Added Class Support Line item to help with classes that have not been able to fundraise last year due to Covid
 - Added line item Langley Support for Staff to help in challenging situations
 - Increased line item Saxon Spirit
 - Budget will be posted on website with the meeting minutes
 - Motion to approve the budget-Heather Murphy Capps, Sonaal Luthra. All Approved
- Membership/Fundraising: Melissa Schwartz & Kristen Simko

- Membership 351 parent members (59% of 600 parent member goal) and just 1 shy of our total last year parent membership of 352. We have 20 students and 102 teacher members, tracking slightly less than last year's membership
- Donations We have \$47,605 in donations, or 84% of our budget. This number far exceeds our total donations for last year which totaled \$42,050
- Car Donations are the big-ticket items-if anyone knows anyone who would like to donate?
- Will push Amazon Smile and Harris Teeter in different ways
- Investigating donating old electronics
- QR Codes have made it easier for families to join
- o Future possibly QR codes at sporting events for people to join?

 - o Only 2 applications have been submitted
 - Process has changed this year since teachers are in the building, they will email forms and use the PDF file in the office
