- Bylaws Highlights and Changes for 2022
 - Hand out of Local Unit Organizational Structure Form
 - As of 2023 Virginia PTA is doing away with the President Elect position
 - We at Langley wanted to keep this position and we were told no we could not, but we could restructure our VP position to include President Elect
 - We will have a President, Treasurer and only one Secretary. Going forward our 1st VP will be our Communications VP and will function as our President Elect and be front and center training to be President but will still need to be voted in the next year.
 - Membership is now 2nd VP
 - Fundraising is now 3rd VP
 - Appropriations and PDF VPs are now combined to be 4th VP-Appropriations since they functions are related. We will need collaborations from all the VPs for Appropriations.
 - Term Limits-Only allowed to have all Officers term be 1 year or all be 2 years. Will be harder to recruit a President with a 2-year term so went with 1-year terms. Officers have a 1-year term with option of doing a maximum of 2 consecutive terms
 - Number of meetings per Year is a minimum of 4
